The 2nd Al-Quds International Conference on Anesthesia

In Ramallah, from the 14-17 of Dec 2017, IMET2000-Pal was honoured to be part of the 2nd Al-Quds International Conference on Anesthesia ICU and Pain Management. IMET2000 invited four speakers, three of them are international from UK, Dr Abdelstar Ravalia, Dr Lowri Bowen, Dr Nur Lubiez, consultants in Anesthesia. Their participation was part of a program called: Anesthesia Training Program. They enriched the conference by giving new updates in Anesthesia. The fourth speaker, Dr Mohammad Obeidallah a research officer in IMET2000-PAL, he gave a lecture on a study which was conducted by our team under the title "Cross-Sectional Survey of Compliance of Health Workers with Infection Control Measures in the West Bank Governmental Hospitals". Dr Malik Zaben CEO of IMET2000 expressed his increased interest in Anesthesia Training program and emphasized the importance of similar future activities.



IMET2000-Pal Sponsored 4 Nurses from Bethlehem University

As a part of its programs in developing the health sector, IMET2000-Pal support 4 nurses from Bethlehem University: Mr Ismat Awawdeh, Mr Tamer Jafal, Ms Dana Noor, and Mrs Khitam Harb, in the High Diploma Program on Oncology Nursing and Palliative Care Training at the Beatson Cancer Center in Glasgow for approximately a month. The students praised the training, which represents a qualitative shift in the transfer of nursing service for cancer patients in Palestine, from monitoring and early detection to rehabilitation programs for patients.



Third Tour in Anaesthesia Training Program

In cooperation between IMET2000-PAL and WFSA, Dr Lowri Bowen and Dr Nur Lubies who are anaesthetists, travelled from the UK to Palestine as part of Anesthesia Training Program and have just finished their rotation from 2/12 to 17/12/2017 in Al-Makased Hospital, Palestine Medical Complex (PMC), Rafeedia Hospital, and Al-Ahli Hospital. The program supports safe global anaesthesia and helps Palestinian colleagues in their ability to use existing ultrasound equipment to offer regional anaesthesia techniques to their adult and pediatric patients.
