IMET2000 Responds to Urgent Needs of Taffouh / Hebron to Fight Against COVID-19 Outbreak

We in IMET2000 have partnered with local authorities on a package of support to help the local community in Hebron respond to the COVID-19 outbreak; particularly in Taffouh. As an immediate response we have made available 1000 masks and 200 bottles of Hand Gel sanitisers to assist the local community response effort and fight against this unprecedented situation. This is in addition to providing all essential toiletries to all in-patients being treated in local COVID-19 centres in Hebron. This effort is just one of the ways the charity is currently trying to support Palestinian Ministry of Health and other NGOs fight against this pandemic.

IMET2000 Continues to Support the Rawan Child Development Association

IMET2000-PAL in cooperation with The Rawan Child Development Association has completed the treatment of 10 children with speech and learning difficulties.

The sessions served to improve the children's educational and cognitive skills. According to the CEO of IMET2000, Dr Malik Zaben, these sessions were part of IMET2000's bigger goal of improving therapeutic care in Palestine, and that helping these children integrate into regular schools is of utmost importance.

IMET2000 Concludes Its 9th Training Session on Medical Scientific Research Methods

In line with its vision to improve the medical sector in Palestine, IMET2000-PAL held its 9th training session in Medical Research Methodology on the 26th June 2020 via Zoom.

The training was run by our CEO Dr Malik Zaben and was attended by 15 medical students and young healthcare professionals from all across the West Bank.

The training began with a detailed explanation from Dr Zaben on the importance of clinical audit and clinical research and on how to go about conducting a research project, and concluded with a discussion of the attendees' own clinical research proposals.
