IMET2000 Awards New Partial Scholarships to Medical and Nursing Students Across Palestinian Universities

As part of its ongoing efforts to support healthcare education in Palestine, IMET2000 has awarded a new round of scholarships for 2026 to 19 medical and nursing students from several Palestinian universities, including Palestine Polytechnic University, Al-Quds University, An-Najah National University, and the Arab American University-Palestine.

The programme aims to enhance access to education and support students in continuing their studies despite ongoing circumstances. By providing this support, IMET2000 contributes to the development of future healthcare professionals, helping them remain focused on their academic paths and future careers.



This latest round marks a further step in the development of IMET2000's scholarship programme, enabling it to reach more students and help address the financial challenges that may affect their academic progress.

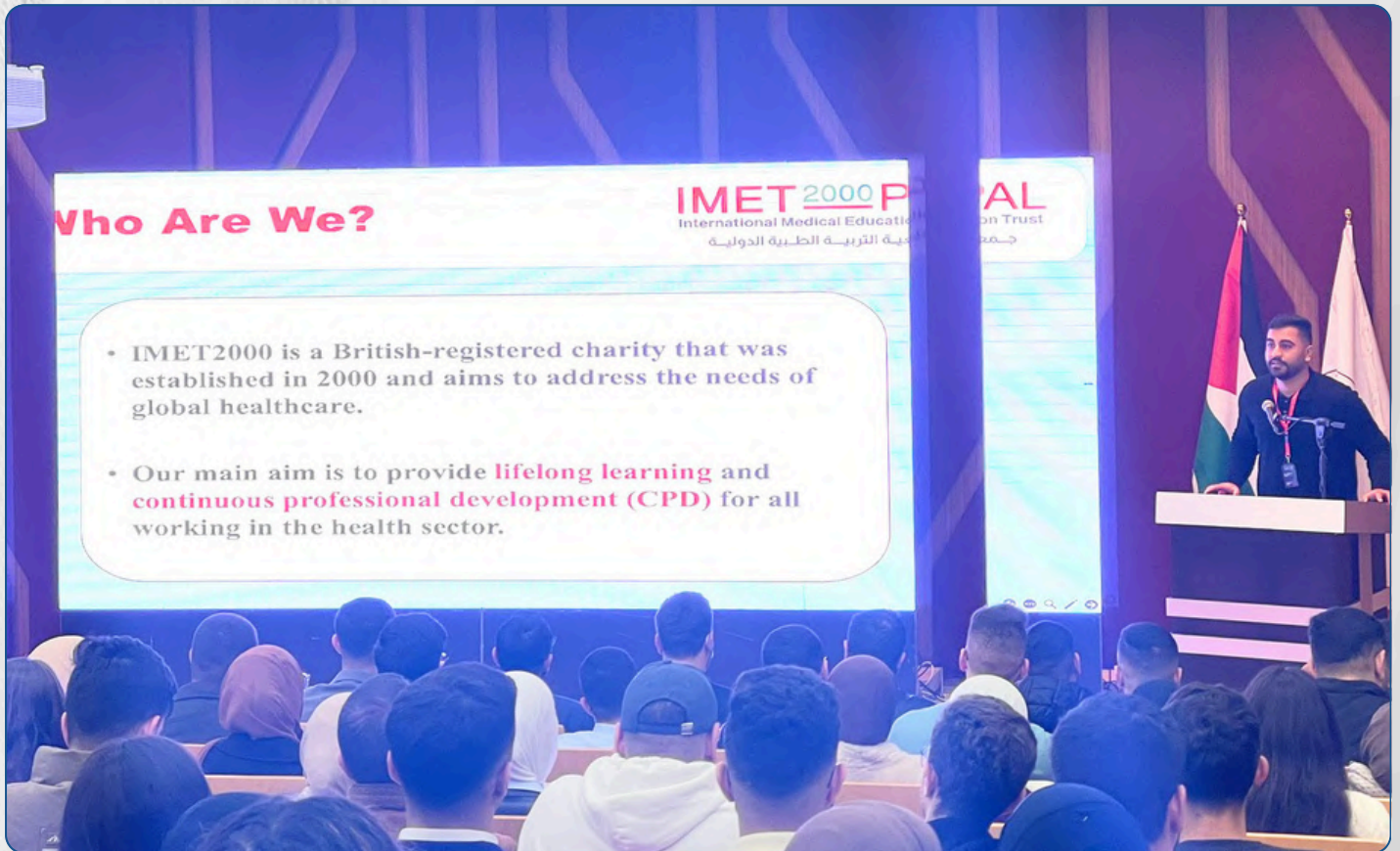
The grantees expressed their appreciation, noting the positive impact in reducing financial burdens and encouraging them to continue working towards their academic and professional goals.

IMET2000 Attends the 12th National General Assembly of the Palestinian Medical Students Association (PMSA)

IMET2000 participated in the 12th National Assembly of the Palestine Medical Students' Association (PMSA), which was held this year at the Arab American University - Palestine, Jenin Campus, on 28 March 2026.



Represented by Dr Ahmed Rjoub, Medical Education Officer, and Mr Osama Anaya, Nursing Education Officer, IMET2000 shared its mission, training programmes, and ways to support students' initiatives. The focus was on empowering medical students, boosting their practical skills, and preparing qualified healthcare professionals to serve the community.

The National Assembly is an annual gathering of Palestinian medical students, featuring training, scientific activities, and discussions on key student issues and plans.

On behalf of PMSA, President Osama Abu Seir and Vice President for External Affairs Ibrahim Absa expressed their gratitude and appreciation to IMET2000 for its ongoing support. IMET2000 Delivers BLS Training to Strengthen Life-Saving Skills Among Healthcare Professionals

In emergencies, the right skills save lives. IMET2000-Pal ran two focused workshops on Basic Life Support (BLS), giving healthcare professionals hands-on training to respond confidently in critical situations.

The training focused on building both knowledge and confidence in handling emergencies. Participants received hands-on practice in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for adults, children, and infants, alongside training on the safe and effective use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

The first workshop took place on 7 March at the IMET2000-Pal Training Centre in Ramallah, followed by a second session on 14 March at Friends Medical for Health Creativity Centre in Nablus.

Both workshops were delivered by instructors certified by the American Heart Association (AHA), ensuring participants received up-to-date, standardised training in line with international guidelines.

Through these trainings, IMET2000 continues to equip healthcare professionals with the practical skills they need to respond effectively and save lives.

IMET2000 Organises Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support Training for Healthcare Professionals at IMET2000-Pal Training Centre



IMET2000-Pal held a specialised two-day Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support (ACLS) training workshop for healthcare professionals accredited by the American Heart Association (AHA) at the IMET2000-Pal Training Centre on 28-29 March 2026.



The workshop was attended by six doctors and nurses representing several hospitals. It focused on the key components of advanced cardiopulmonary resuscitation, including the management of respiratory and cardiac arrest, symptomatic bradycardia, airway management, acute stroke care, and ACLS-related medications.

In addition to clinical knowledge and practical skills, the training emphasised the importance of clear communication and strong leadership within ACLS teams. The aim was to improve coordinated and timely decision-making during high-risk emergencies.
